East Winds District Annual Conference

Minutes of Saturday, November 7, 2020 By Webinar pre-recorded and live at Clarkston United Methodist Church Clarkston Michigan

Day's Events included Worship, District Conference and Training Webinar

The Third Annual District Conference of the East Winds District, Michigan Conference of the United Methodist Churches was held on Saturday, November7, 2020. Gathering worship music was opened by musical team (led by Kevin Marsee, Fenton UMC). Rev. John Hice welcomed all to the First United Methodist Church of Clarkston, MI via cyber space connections. Opening Prayer was read by Pastor Julia Cramer, of Cole & Melvin UMCs (written by Cynthia Rossman and Julia Cramer). Rev Hice, District Superintendent introduced our speaker, Bishop Laurie Haller, Iowa Conference UMC, with her message of "Wandering into Grace".

Offering by online donations through pay pal and check were received to benefit the Asbury Community Development Corporation (CDC, Flint) which includes Hoop Farms providing food to the community and the South Flint Soup Kitchen (meals and clothing). The Blue Water Free Store and Ministry Center location in Port Huron, is a place for community to gather for spiritual and basic needs assistance, besides providing clothing and home goods at the free store. A video played showing the mission work each ministry provides to their communities. Rev Sari Brown, of Harbor Beach and Port Sanilac UMCs gave the Offering Prayer. The Hymn "It Is Well with My Soul" concluded the worship service.

DISTRICT CONFERENCE:

The Business Session of the East Winds District Conference was called to order by Rev. Hice, District Superintendent. The East Winds District is a corporation in the State of Michigan and our East Winds District Leadership Team serves as our Board of Directors. Cheryl Rentschler, Executive Assistant for the East Winds District was named as the recording secretary for the session. Conference documents were made available by email or download from the <u>www.EastWindsConference.com</u> site. The November 7th, 2020, District Conference minutes, found on pages 5 & 6 were viewed, electronically balloted and approved.

District Superintendent Report, Rev Hice shared his report as the 2020 year in the East Winds District was a year of Profiles in Courage by laity, local church, clergy and their congregations who stepped up and out to work against the Great Pandemic of 2020. Once it was determined that churches should distance themselves from each other, options were found to still witness and provide for nutritional and spiritual needs for congregations and their communities. Rev Hice was pleased to hear of reports from clergy all the ways to minister to others with personal distancing and consideration to others. Online service attendance increased, sack lunches were passed out, worship services were done outside or in gymnasiums. Courage is measured by the extent to which one extends themself to accomplish what is right or what is needed in the face of sacrifice, risk, and effort. I could write a profile of courage for every pastor, deacon, and congregation serving in the East Winds District. Each of your stories have led us into places and times of God's grace.

Blue Water Free Store and Ministry Center adjusted to restrictions imposed by the COVID 19 Pandemic. Flint Missions developed significantly with the building of additional hoop houses and continued operation of Asbury Farms, the consolidation of South Flint Soup Kitchen and Flint Recovery with Asbury Community Development Corporation. The consolidation of United Methodist mission endeavors in Flint is expected to strengthen our ministry with the people of Flint.

Recovery ministry continues in response to the Flint Water Crisis as learning disabilities, violence, unemployment, housing needs, and continued needs for nutritious foods for mitigating the effects of lead and other heavy metal poisoning continues, even as the need for bottled water eases. Funds from the Bishop's Appeal of 2016 have been transferred to the East Winds District treasury for continued support of this ongoing work.

Rev Hice shared information about our staff and future plans.:

- Cheryl Rentschler served as the East Winds District Executive Assistant from her remote office at home, masterful in organizing ministry and functions of the district.
- Eva Jankowski, East Winds District Administrative Assistant worked from her remote home office, Monday and Thursday, she organized countless forms received from churches and district agencies, made certain phone calls and mail are redirected to district staff, and provided essential support for Cheryl's work.
- Linda Squires, District Treasurer. Linda maintained our financial records, received district funds, and kept our bills paid. She also serves as an essential leader on EWD Leadership and Finance Teams.
- Pastor Gregory Timmons completed his service as Flint Recovering Coordinator as his role as Pastor of Flint: Calvary United Methodist Church became a full-time appointment on September 1. His ministry as Recovery Coordinator effectively led to this moment, as we turn to the next chapter of ministry conducted by Flint churches, the Flint Mission Zone, and the Asbury CDC.
- Rev. Christy White served as the East Winds District Coordinator of Discipleship Formation, organizing district-wide youth events and consulting with mission zones and churches for the development of Christian education and young people's ministry. Rev. White was hired by the Michigan Conference as the Coordinator of Youth Ministries. Her position with the district was closed as East Winds joins other districts enjoying connectional support provided from the Conference.
- A new position: East Winds District Leadership Team recently approved the creation of a new position, Applied Missions Coordinator. Our experience in organizing VIM projects in 2019 and 2020 taught us that communications with UMCOR and other agencies organizing mission work projects, as well as organizing, training, and leading our groups is a task which exceeds the scope that can be reasonable for a volunteer. This new staff person will accomplish this needed support, as well as assist mission zones and local churches that wish to engage in hands-on mission work. The position is expected to be developed and filled in the coming months.

In the face of it all, leadership in East Winds district and our 91 churches have shown the face of courage. Together, we have weathered fierce storms and pressed on to keep our eyes on Jesus while we have cared for all God's children, advocated for justice, proclaimed the Good News of salvation, and worked for peace. Together, we have been the Church: a profile of courage could be written for all of you.

Leadership Team Chair Report: Rev Curtis Clarke, So much changed since we began the year. As we prepared for 2020, we did so, expecting to see our denomination making plans for the inevitable separation that we knew was coming. What we didn't expect though, was to be held in the grip of a global pandemic. We did not expect to celebrate Easter from our living rooms and kitchen tables. We did not expect the drive through graduation parades and food pantries. We didn't expect to see our hospitals at capacity with sick patients. We didn't expect to have to do virtual funeral services and say goodbye to loved ones from care center windows and iPads. It is not what we expected, but it is what we experienced.

As your district leadership team, we saw you...we saw the faithful mission of Christ you lived out. We heard of your good works, your new ministries, you marching for justice, we heard your words of peaceful protest, we saw your parking lot worship services, your socially distant drive-in movie nights, you doing all you could the unique season of ministry to *Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World*. We see you; we hear you, and we are humbled to be in ministry alongside you.

Finance Team:

Informational: The fiduciary body known as the East Winds District Leadership Team are also the Trustees of the East Winds District Corporation. The Finance Team is the overseer of the District Treasury and recommends to approve disbursements of loans and grants with reports to the Leadership Team of its determination and action taken.

Budget/Financials: Linda Squires, Treasurers of the East Winds District Finance Team Leadership Team, shared the last years actions of the Finance committee in approving grants and loans to local churches, mission and ministries of the East Winds District. She also presented the 2021 budget numbers, 2020 year to date financials and 2019 4th quarter financials for approval. The total East Winds District Budget for 2021 presented was \$224,443.00(included funding for Urban Ministries, District Missional Projects, Superintendent Projects, Leadership Team Expenses, Staff Salary and Operations Costs). Finance Team financials, budget and report were found on pages 12 through 27.

The 2021 proposed budget amount is then offset with Special Endowment Grant and Endowment/Loan Fund Dividends/Interest subsidies of \$8923.00 and \$65,000 respectively which results in the calculation of East Winds District Ministry Shares final amount of \$150,520.00. The ministry shares breakout was reflected in the distributed booklet.

Financials Discussion: A question was raised from Rev Carol Bouse and Pastor Greg Timmons about loan balances reflected in the financials. Eastwood UMC had closed and sold property, but did not have mortgage liens on them, so any proceeds from sale were distributed to the Michigan Conference, with loan balance rea. e Eastwood loan would be written off the district's financials. The Flint Charity properties were being sold on 11.7.2020 and any remaining balances would be absorbed pursuant to the merger of the Flint Charity and Flint Calvary UMCs that occurred in 2020.

The 2021 East Winds District Budget and financial reports were approved by electronic ballot.

Nominations: The slate of the East Winds District leadership teams and committees were reviewed as presented by Rev Hice. Nominations were closed and the entire slate were voted on by electronic ballot and approved. The Book of Discipline requires elections of the following committees: Leadership Team and its corporate officers, nominations committee, district committee on ordained ministry, district board of church and location and building and district committee on superintendency.

Prerecorded reports were presented and were also found in the District Conference booklet for and by: Board of Laity : District Co-Lay Leaders, Cynthia Rossman and Bonnie Potter Lay servant Report: Pastor Kristen LePalm, Thomas UMC, District Lay Servant Director Board of Church Location and Building : District Co-Chairs: Bob Wyatt and Pastor Jerry Griggs Additional reports included: Clergy Church Contact information, District Staff Contact information, Missional Zone Plan and List, Special Sunday Offering Calendar, 2021 East Winds District General Monthly Calendar.

Volunteers in Mission (VIM) Puerto Rico video from March 2020 was played to end the 2020 Business Session. Rev Hice shared some ending comments how great it was to participate in the mission to Puerto Rico and How it was a blessing to be in partnership, sharing and relationship in Christ. A life giving ministry for all involved.

Rev Hice then adjourned the business meeting. A teaching and discussion session would follow after a fiveminute break, joining Bishop Haller in teaching us about "Being the Church".

East Winds District Superintendent's Report November 6, 2021

You might have seen the same feature at the end of an evening new broadcast. A woman in France, advanced in age and yet still an aviator fulfilled a lifelong dream. She took flight in an ultralight and soared upward until she joined a flock of geese that, in V-formation, were on their migratory journey to a warmer climate. The video footage of her webcam was stunning: close-up action of a goose in-flight; if a bird can be said to have a facial expression, it was the look of focus and determination. Looking ahead as if it has one goal from which it would not be deterred while strong, graceful wings moved up-and-down with a steady rhythm.

20 months of COVID 19 reports, quarantine, struggles over wearing masks, distancing, and vaccination policies; balancing the need to gather with the need to care for one another's health; caring for people in extreme need and working for justice in the face of it all. Last year we marveled at the innovation of pastors, lay leadership, and members gifted in technology. This year, I marvel at your perseverance.

20 months, and our ministry is strong, and overall, our churches are healthier than we thought that they could be. Even so, we are at a point in our migration where it is dawning on us, I think, that our innovation can no longer be thought-of as stop gap. We have been changed. Like the bird with look of determination worn all over its face, churches across the East Winds District are gathering a new sense of mission.

One Profile of the Church form after another reflect a similar pattern: "Our numbers are still down inchurch, but we have many more who still connect over livestream worship, offering is nearly as good as it was before the pandemic (some even say it's better), and we are feeding more, caring for more, loving more than we ever did before.

This has been a hard flight for us. And yet, churches in our mission zones have given each other support; the work of pastors grounded at home or in the hospital were covered by colleagues and lay speakers; churches have become the nests of invention where anyone's idea can become a fruitful endeavor. The systems we put in place over long years of connectional life have largely worked. Our flock's formation has remained intact even in the atmosphere's turbulence.

The East Winds District is well; and you are to be regarded as the faithful reason for it.

District leadership has played its part in this. I'm thankful for our District Leadership Team led by Pastor Curtis Clark, and members of our boards, committees, and ministry teams who have kept the rhythm of God's work. I'm thankful for East Winds clergy and church members; and I lift our staff with continued deep respect and appreciation:

- Cheryl Rentschler serves as the East Winds District Executive Assistant. From her home office she has been masterful in organizing the ministry and functions of the district, consulting and assisting me, providing guidance and training for leaders in our churches, and setting-up hundreds of Zoom sessions!
- Eva Jankowski is our Administrative Assistant who organizes your countless forms, redirects phone calls and mail to district staff, and gives essential support for Cheryl's work.

- Linda Squires provides essential service as our District Treasurer. Linda receives district funds, maintains our financial records, keeps our bills paid and serves on our Leadership and Finance Teams.
- We have now filled out a new position. Our work projects in Puerto Rico for 2019 and 2020 taught
 us that the work that goes into organizing, training, and leading our groups for mission work
 projects poses an unreasonably large task for one or even two volunteers. Rev. Carol Blair Bouse
 continues, half-time, as pastor of Flint Hope United Methodist Church and serves half-time as our
 new Applied Missions Coordinator. In her new role, she will give needed organizational support for
 district hands-on missions such as our work in Puerto Rico, as well as assist our mission zones
 and local churches that wish in similar projects.

2021 has continued the period of innovation on the district as well as our local congregations. The Missions in Flint have functioned well after last year's consolidation within the umbrella of the Asbury Community Development Corporation; the Blue Water Ministry Center and Free Store have grappled with decreased volunteer help and leadership and keeps the ministry to the community going; and our Finance Team has issued many grants to churches to assist in the purchase of high-tech equipment and the training it takes to use it. Our ministry is strong, and it is relevant.

We will continue to adapt to a new world. The 2021 Annual Conference acted to create a task force charged with bringing a proposal to reduce the number of districts in the Michigan Conference by at least one. This makes likely a change in district lines and the number of churches and clergy that will be organized in the remaining districts as of January 2023. Budget constraints are changing the way district superintendents do the work of mission strategy, connection, consultation, and supervision. We will continue to hold more meetings by videoconference while East Winds and at least four additional districts move to organize virtual offices rather than continue high-lease physical locations.

We continue to be redefined. Yet, we also continue to be Christ's church: resilient, faithful, and committed to the mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

Leadership in East Winds district and our 90 churches have shown the face of determination. Together, we have weathered fierce storms and pressed on, keeping our eyes on Jesus while we have cared for all God's children, advocated for justice, proclaimed the Good News of salvation, and worked for peace.

Together, we have been the Church.

East Winds District Board of Missions and Church Extension/Finance Team

The Board of Missions and Church Extension/Finance Team focuses on supporting the district churches through grants and loans. Funding for the budget comes from District Ministry Shares, Endowment and Loan Fund dividends and interest as well as funds from our endowment.

The East Winds Finance Team members are: Chairperson David Slates, Treasurer Linda Squires, Roger Brimley, Carole Cunningham, Kathy Dorman, Gordon Fisher, Carol Kandell, John Sayer, Barry Trantham, and Paul Tiedeman.

The Board appreciates the support and input of District Superintendent Hice. Special thanks are extended to Executive Assistant Cheryl Rentschler for her help and to Administrative Assistant Eva Jankowske for serving as recording secretary.

The 2021 District budget, in addition to operational monies, includes funding for the following grant and loan opportunities:

- Connectional Program grant requests which include special programs, youth projects, and church development projects are considered annually at our spring meeting.
- Special needs grant requests are considered throughout the year. While they are not strictly defined, they may not include staffing or capital improvement projects.
- 3:1 challenge grants, considered throughout the year, provide \$1 for every \$3 of new money raised by the requesting church. Challenge grants may be used for technology equipment or for seed money for starting new programs.
- Barrier free grants of \$500 will be considered throughout the year for projects which improve accessibility for the physically challenged.
- Loans are made available for up to \$50,000 using the same interest rate as the Michigan Area Loan Fund with a duration not to exceed 90 months. Loans are available to assist churches with capital improvements or as a bridge to a bank loan.

A 6 month \$45000 bridge loan was awarded to Asbury CDC to cover them until their grants come in.

The 2021 budget includes \$113,000 for grants and another \$38,000 for mission projects. A \$20,000 mission project was added this year for InterVarsity Campus Ministries to help them expand into St. Clair and Mott Community Colleges.

The Board plans to meet Quarterly with the flexibility to meet on additional dates if the need arises.

The deadline to submit Connectional Grant applications is March 31, 2022. Applications for New Developing Ministries, Special Needs Grants, Barrier Free Grants, 3:1 Grants and loan requests may be submitted throughout the year.

Greetings to all from the East Winds District Lay Servant Ministries Committee!

Through the year 2021 the Committee on Lay Servant Ministries has continued to work toward offering lay servants opportunities to grow in their leadership skills and in their discipleship. The unique situation that everyone has found themselves in did impact the program to a certain degree, but due to the Lord's blessing we were still able to provide classes to many people.

In the spring of 2021 classes were organized in the ZOOM format in an attempt to keep everyone safe and healthy. We were able to run 5 classes in a multi-week format: the Introduction to Lay Servant Ministries, Called to Preach, Discovering Your Spiritual Gifts, Leading Worship, and Living Our United Methodist Beliefs. Our facilitators were Rev. Greg Timmons, Rev. Lisa Clark, Rev. Tim Callow, Rev. Dianne VanMarter, Dewb Sturm, and Karen Knight Price. 39 Lay Servants were able to continue their studies and growth through these classes and many of those completed the requirement to become a Certified Lay Servant.

As we moved into the fall it was decided to offer classes once again in two formats. Some classes were organized using the in-person format, while others continued with the ZOOM format. Five classes were once again offered with 21 people being able to participate. Leading these classes were Ted Alkins, Becki Brice, Cindy Rossman, Linda Schramm and Claudia Bowers. The ZOOM format was once again successful as it allowed participants to take more than one class, not have to worry about travel, take classes in their PJs and be able to be more flexible in scheduling. Offering classes in both formats looks like it is the plan of the future.

East Winds District continues to grow in its number of lay servants, certified lay servants and certified lay speakers. In 2021 four certified lay servants completed their coursework to become Certified Lay Speakers. They will be commissioned later in the fall. We have over 600 people serving in lay ministry in one form or another. Some people have let their certification lapse, so we are encouraging Pastors and other laity to issue words of encouragement for all to explore their gifts and ministry interests and consider taking workshop courses. We are growing due to the inpouring of the Holy Spirit and are excited about all of the opportunities which are in front of us. We thank God for blessing you all.

Board of Location & Building Report 2021 East Winds District Annual Conference

The Board of Location & Building worked several churches on a variety of issues this year. Here are some thoughts from our work with district churches.

SALE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY

The sale of church buildings and real estate by discipline must be reviewed by our committee. We reviewed requests to sell unused parsonages. Unused parsonages are likely to lose their property tax exemption increasing the cost to the local church of retaining a parsonage. Several churches evaluated their need to retain unused parsonages realizing savings by eliminating the cost of maintenance and utilities. We also review the request of merging churches to sell the sanctuary and parsonage no longer needed after the church merger.

MOLD ASSESSMENT & REMEDIATION

Several churches consulted with our board regarding concerns relating to visible mold. It is critical that mold be properly evaluated by a qualified firm and remediated per recommendations. The use of mold testing kits from building supply stores is not advisable. Care needs to be taken to make sure the mold is not a health risk for those cleaning up the mold or those using the property after clean up. Some molds are hazardous requiring protective gear and air monitoring. Other molds present minimal risk.

Any roof leak or flooding from rain water runoff needs to be cleaned up properly and promptly. Mold requires moisture to spread. It cannot be 'killed' by a paint product. It is not safe to use chlorine bleach to clean up mold. Dead airborne spores can be as dangerous as live spores.

The state does not license mold testing or remediation firms. The better firms will have trade association certifications. Good testing firms take test samples and cultures and have them analyzed in a laboratory. Good remediation firms base their remediation work either on the results of a testing firm or their own testing. Good firms also do a posttest to verify that they have removed the molds of concern and expect that a testing firm may also be used to confirm mold removal.

ANNUAL TRUSTEE PARSONAGE & CHURCH INSPECTIONS

It is critical that the annual parsonage & church inspections be conducted and that both the church parsonage and church building be kept in good condition. This should include a check for mold in the basement, bathrooms and kitchen especially under any sinks. The ground outside of the building should pitch away from the parsonage or church. The gutters and downspouts should extend 2-3' away from the building and carry rain water runoff away from the building.

CHURCH CLOSINGS

As required by the Book of Discipline, our board is represented at any local church charge conference where closing of a church is planned. We serve as a resource for closing local churches as church real estate is transitioned to the Michigan Conference Board of Trustees.

ROOF REPAIR

Delay of roof repair after the roof starts to leak result in damage to ceilings, furniture, electronic equipment or furniture. Roof leaks can result in a mold problem.

ENGAGE-MI 2020 REPORT

EngageMi is the mission engagement program for the Michigan Conference. EngageMi challenges Michigan Conference congregations to comprehensive missional learning, giving, and action with the goal of encouraging congregations to shift from transactional "ministry to" models to relational "ministry with" vulnerable people and communities. The EngageMi program consists of three focus areas: Learn, Give, Act. Congregations who meet the requirements in all three areas will be recognized as "EngageMi Congregations." You can find more information about the program online at <u>www.michiganumc.org/engage-mi</u>.

Despite all the challenges that 2020 presented, 89 churches submitted Engage-MI reports. Forty-nine churches completed all of three of the focus areas to qualify as Engage MI churches. All the churches told God-filled stories of ministry. Regardless of being closed to in-person worship most of the year, congregations found new creative and intentional means of remaining connected and caring for each other and their communities. Many of the stories told of an unexpected and amazing increase in giving due to the need created by the increase in food insecurity.

Buildings may have been closed to many of the normal congregational activities but the United Methodists in Michigan are still doing God's work, locally and globally. All to the Glory of God!

East Winds District that became EngageMI Churches

Gaines, Grand Blanc, Flint: Court Street, Flushing, Lennon, Lexington, Sandusky: First, South Mundy, Port Huron: First, West Deerfield Ministry at the Blue Water Free store and ministry center in Port Huron has been met with both challenges and blessings this year.

Backed by financial support from the East Winds District, Local churches and individual donors, the Free store has continued to meet and serve the needs of their community by providing free clothing, household items, furnishings and even some limited food items during this year. While covid 19 has challenged us, the ministry is still very much about serving and loving neighbor as Jesus tells us too.

This year has seen the ministry center open its doors to four new recovery and AA groups who have been able to use the meeting rooms for weekly gatherings, even during some of the hardest days of the pandemic.

While the number of volunteers who give of their time has lessened, the staff that remains is generous with their time, talents, gifts, service and witness. They have adapted to new protocols for cleaning and receiving in of donations and are always available to care for the needs of those who come to the Free store.

As we look forward to a new year, we have several goals on the horizon;

- 1. Hire a part-time director to help grow and expand the ministry.
- 2. Expand the pool of volunteers.
- 3. Continue to improve our facilities.
- 4. Make deeper connections in our community to better serve the needs of our guests.

Flint: Asbury Community Development Corporation (Flint CDC) and its' various missions including the South Flint Soup Kitchen

Feed Flint is a new ministry of the **Flint Asbury Community Development Corporation**, our East Winds District's Flint Mission Zone consolidated missions' activity. Feed Flint represents a shift of our mission ministry focus to the long-term recovery of Flint. Those recovering from the long-term impacts of lead in water need access to fresh vegetables in an area where access to fresh vegetables is very limited. . .

Asbury Farms, born out of Asbury United Methodist Church in Flint, has provided fresh food to the hungry of

the city during the season of COVID-19. Asbury Farms is one of the largest urban agriculture sites in the U.S. ~ Facebook/Asbury Farms

A key piece of Asbury's response during the pandemic "was home delivery." The church teamed up with the Genesee County Sheriff's Department. "We then did two things with what the Sheriff called our 'porch deliveries," McDoniel recalls. "We dropped off bottled water and food that included fresh produce, serving 100 households a week." The fresh produce came from Asbury Farms, the urban agriculture initiative born out of Asbury Church. McDoniel explains, "We were harvesting in April because we harvest cold climate crops every month of the Michigan year out of our hoop houses."

South Flint Soup Kitchen located in South Flint serves the poorest zip code in Flint which is the poorest city of its size in America. Asbury CDC operates additional missional ministries in East Flint. This includes the largest urban farm in Michigan.

Pastor Tommy McDoniel says that Asbury Church was asked to assist during COVID "because we were already geared up. We were a community Help Center providing water and food every Tuesday. It became more intense during COVID as people were panicking." He saw more cars driving to the Help Center after March 2020.

Busy at meal prep in July 2021. The South Side Soup Kitchen in Flint has served meals six days a week throughout the months of the pandemic. Food is now take-away rather than the sit-down lunches served

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services funds the rest of the food for distribution at the Help Centers and porch deliveries. DHHS funds three trailers full of \$5,000 worth of groceries driven to each of the Help Centers every week.

The Kitchen reorganized from sit-down meals to take-away. An Angels Closet at the site offers free clothing and household goods. The Flint Mission Zone of the East Winds District of The Michigan Conference supports the South Side Soup Kitchen, operated out of the former Lincoln Park United Methodist Church. The South Side Soup Kitchen has operated six days a week, never once shutting down during COVID."

McDoniel estimates that over the past 12 months, there have been an estimated 50,000 visits to the Soup Kitchen, Asbury Farm, and Asbury main campus.

The power of connection

"When I spoke at the awards ceremony," McDoniel continues, "I stressed that to make this vital outreach possible, Asbury depended on the residents we were serving to act as volunteers to help each other. The Help Centers have activated the community to help their neighbors." He adds that partnerships come naturally to United Methodists. "We are connected in The United Methodist Church. East Winds District Mission Zone Plan

Mission. Organize churches and communities of the East Winds District in areas, which will be named "Mission Zones" for the purpose of assessing congregational and connectional vitality; strategically plan and implement shared ministries and church configurations; and engage in shared mission within communities of the zone. STATEST STATEST

Zone Management. Mission Zones will be composed of 4-6 congregations located in relatively close proximity in a geographical

area. Attention will also be given to churches that currently work together when mapping and organizing the zones. Zone leadership teams will consist of one clergy and one layperson from each congregation. The leadership team of each zone will meet on a regular basis in consultation with the district superintendent for planning and assessing the function of the zone. One zone member will be selected by the district superintendent to be its facilitator. All zones in the East Winds District will function within the scope of the District Superintendent's role as Chief Missional Strategist and the EAST WINDS DISTRICT Vision Team.

Assessment. Churches within each zone will develop and implement a plan for assessing each of the congregations. Principally, tools likely to be used for these assessments will be chosen from ¶213 (*2016 Discipline*), *MissionInsite*, and/or another tool that is deemed appropriate. The zone will work with the district superintendent, the EAST WINDS DISTRICT ¶213 Team, DAC/MAC Director of Congregational Resiliency, DAC/MAC Director of New Church Development, and/or other consultants considered appropriate. The assessments will be used to address congregational and missional needs of the zone.

Configuration Development. Results of the congregational and connectional assessment will used by the Mission Zone Team and district superintendent to implement appropriate approaches to vitalize congregations, share ministries, consider and put into effect mergers, discontinuations, new worship services, cooperative parishes, and new church starts. The aim is to mobilize United Methodist mission and congregational life within each zone according to the needs and opportunities of the greater community.

Actualizing the Michigan Conference Vision. The vision of the Michigan Annual Conference centers in Christ to foster vibrant congregations, mission and ministry, and bold and effective leaders. Each zone will develop a strategy for identifying measurable results in each of these areas, planning and implementing program ministries accordingly. Each zone and its congregations will develop, coordinate, implement, and evaluate its strategic plan consistent with this vision.

Approach. East Winds District will develop and implement its network of mission zones with an orderly approach. The initial pattern, will begin with a meeting of the churches' clergy, followed by the selection of laity and establishment of regular team meetings. Team meetings will focus on prayer, planning and evaluation. Mutual support is also expected, but not dominate or replace the mission of the zone. The Vision Team will consider these revelations and consistently revise the plan. It will continue to give oversight and support to the mission zones as they develop.
